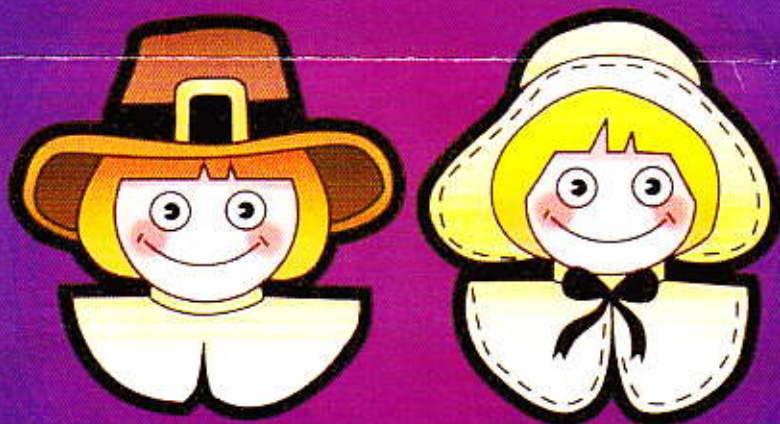

The session held their regular meeting on October 13, 2009.

Clerk Report: Linda McClellan announced that she will resign as clerk of session effective December 31, 2009.

Buildings & Grounds: The door to the basement entrance has been replaced by Butch Janning. He also fixed the steps on the west basement door and did some caulking to fill gaps.

The copier lease expires October 26. Bro Business will pick up the copier and extra toner cartridges. Stacy Determann presented several proposals to the session to purchase a copier. A Brother digital copier will be purchased from the Quill Company.

Christian Education: The Children's Christmas program will be December 20.

Parish Life: Thanksgiving potluck will be November 22. Dean Lamp will assist with the meal that day. Don at Glidden Grocery will prepare two turkeys and Tim Reeve will be asked to prepare a pork loin.

Worship: Pulpit supply is needed for November 8 and 15.

Hanging of the greens will be November 29. The committee would like to replace the Christmas tree this year as the old one had to have lights repaired last year. The PW will be asked to purchase two artificial poinsettias as the sanctuary gets too cold for real ones to survive.

Following the regular session meeting, Richard Francis from COM met with the session to discuss the next steps needed to find a new pastor. A church information form needs to be completed. Then a PNC Committee can be formed to begin the search. Nominees for committee members for both the CIF development and the PNC were discussed. Lora Reeve will contact CIF candidates and Stacy will contact PNC candidates.

Rev. Francis informed the session of several possible candidates who may be interested in stated supply. He will email the names and contact information to the clerk when he receives it.

Community of Concern Food Drive

The Carroll Community of Concern Food Pantry provides food for residents of Carroll County. In 2008, 2868 meals were provided to 956 people representing 367 families. As of September 30, 307 households have been helped in 2009.

'Hunger Hurts' food drive will be conducted during November. As Presbyterians, we will have a table set up for donations during the month of November. Cash donations will also be accepted for the purchase of milk, eggs, meat, potatoes, and other fresh food items.

The Community of Concern is asking for the following items: peanut butter, soup, cereal, tomato products (sauce, canned, juice, spaghetti sauce), tuna, pasta (spaghetti, egg noodles, macaroni), Hamburger and Tuna Helper, macaroni and cheese, spice packets for chili, tacos, etc, pudding, and canned fruit. Non-food items such as laundry soap, bath soap, toilet tissue and personal care items will also be accepted.
